Firstly I would like to welcome our new and existing members for the 2011 season.

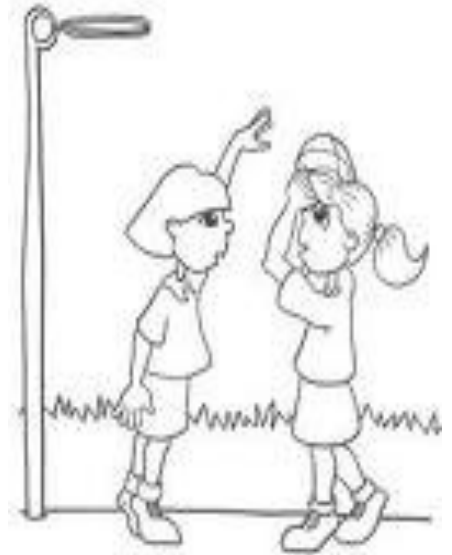

COACHING COURSES

The following **COACHING COURSES** are available at Fremantle Netball Association in 2011

There is a **Junior and Intermediate Coaching Program** Both at FNA on Monday nights 6.30-9.00pm. No Cost. Dates are 18th April; 16th May; 20th June. Coaches who attended these courses last year found them very beneficial and helpful. Registration forms are available on the FNA website.

Courses for **PLAYERS** are as follows:

Primary School Coaching Clinic.

11th July and 12th July. Cost \$60 and numbers capped. Closing date is 4th June. Forms available on FNA website. Participants receive backpack and ball. Teaches skills in a fun environment. This clinic is capped and fills up quickly so book early.

Net Set Go Coaching Clinic

6-7 year olds. Cost \$100 weekly. Commencing 21st May for 10 weeks; 8am Saturday mornings. For pre netball ages especially younger siblings who wish to try their hand at netball.

It is the club policy that all junior players receive equal court time throughout the season. It is far more beneficial for all our junior players to develop equally rotating through all the positions than fielding your strongest side each week to ensure a win. Rotating through all the positions on the court should be done throughout the season not each quarter.

COACHES AND TEAM MANAGERS MEETING WILL BE HELD AT THE LEEMING BOWLING CLUB DIMOND COURT, LEEMING AT 7.30PM WEDNESDAY MAY 4TH.

Leeming Netball Club has always set a high standard of umpires and encouraged young umpires to pick up a whistle and have a go. To any player who is not confident enough to umpire a game it can all start with your club and earn some money as you are older by umpiring for your club or even working at your local Recreation Centre.

Remember our club always backs and supports our umpires and if there is ever a problem contact a committee member.

All Senior , Under 19's and 17's and Year 10's will have weekly team umpiring commitments. It is the responsibility of the team manager to draw up a roster to share the umpiring commitments. Team members who coach for the club are given less or no umpiring duties due to the time given to the club already.

Players are expected to fulfill their umpiring commitment or pay for someone to fill the duty. If a rostered umpire is late or neglects to fulfill their commitment she will be fined \$30 and will incur a 2 point penalty to her teams premiership points.

A roster will be circulated to teams as soon as possible at the beginning of the season to enable the roster to be drawn up.

A list of girls willing to umpire will also be given to the team manager. Anyone willing to be paid for umpiring please contact our Umpiring Co ordinator.

UMPIRING COURSES

Launch up is an umpiring course for juniors. The cost is \$70 and participants will receive a Program Umpires Shirt and a Level 1 manual and coaching This program is mainly held over May and June but participants will have to also umpire on Saturdays and for TID trials.

Parent Umpiring Program is a short development program to assist parents understand the rules of Netball. There is no cost to FNA members. 16th April 2011 at FNA. 10am-12noon.

Netball Australia Development Pathway is a Level 1 Umpiring course and a pre-requisite for National Badging. ! 8th May and 3rd August 6pm—10pm at FNA. Cost \$40 per session.

2011 FNA Basic Umpiring Course

Level 1 umpiring courses are held by Netball WA. For information on how to register for these courses please contact FNA or a committee member. There is no cost if you are a member of FNA.

The FUD (**Fremantle Umpiring Development**) Program will be run from June to August and applications should be lodged by 15th June 2011.
