

Umpiring Program & Training with Fremantle Netball Association

Leeming Netball Club has minimum requirements for umpires who officiate games at Fremantle Netball Association to preserve the quality of umpiring within the club and the quality and safety of games for players.

Leeming Netball Club provides additional mentoring support when available to developing umpiring once umpires have completed the Junior Umpiring Development Program (JUDP) all 3 phases provided by Fremantle Netball Association (FNA).

The club will advise umpires and those who have expressed interest of upcoming upskilling workshops and development opportunities offered by either Netball Australia online or Fremantle Netball Club. This includes practical training opportunities such as School Holiday Umpiring Programs, the JUDP and the Adult Umpiring Development Program (AUDP), as well as theoretical upskilling workshops Fremantle Netball Association run throughout the season.

Leeming Netball Club will support umpires to obtain badges liaising with Fremantle Netball Association's Umpiring Development Officer to have the umpires game observed, and if deemed appropriate, a badging game organised. If successful in gaining their badging qualification, Leeming Netball Club will recognise and present your badge to you at an appropriate event.

Umpire Action Plan:

Players who express interest to umpire with no previous experience are now required to enrol in the Junior Umpiring Development Program (JUDP) trials provided at the end of each season [Junior Umpire Development Program – Fremantle Netball Association](#). Successful umpires are to complete all 3 phases. Mentoring is available during the season after phase 3 completion of the program, each season presents differently with available mentors and may not always be present each week. Below are the documents that are to be completed before starting the JUDP which you will also receive for FNA upon enrolling in the program.

3. Completion of online [Rules of Netball Theory Exam](#) 70% pass is required
4. Completion of the JUDP with FNA (phase 3)
5. Get in touch with the LNC umpiring coordinator and send completed documents to leemingnetballumpire@gmail.com
6. Register in PlayHQ as an 'official' – via LNC Umpiring Coordinator or LNC Registrar.
7. Allocation to Leeming Netball Club games by LNC Umpiring Coordinator
8. Progression to more challenging grades/divisions and withdrawal of mentor if applicable.
9. *Optional* – Testing conducted for gaining National C Badge in coordination with Fremantle Netball Association
10. Continual learning at Fremantle Netball Club workshops that run each season with one workshop compulsory to all umpires. This will affect allocations and progression if not attended.
11. Assessment and feedback to maintain skills and progression within club as arranged by LNC Umpiring Coordinator with a KPI sheet usually conducted in the 3rd round before finals.
